Autonomy to implement innovative approaches in exchange for being held to higher standards of accountability.

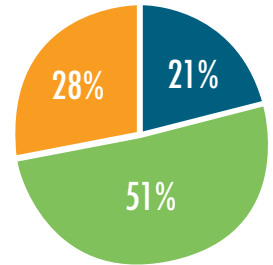

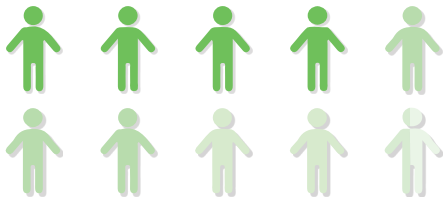

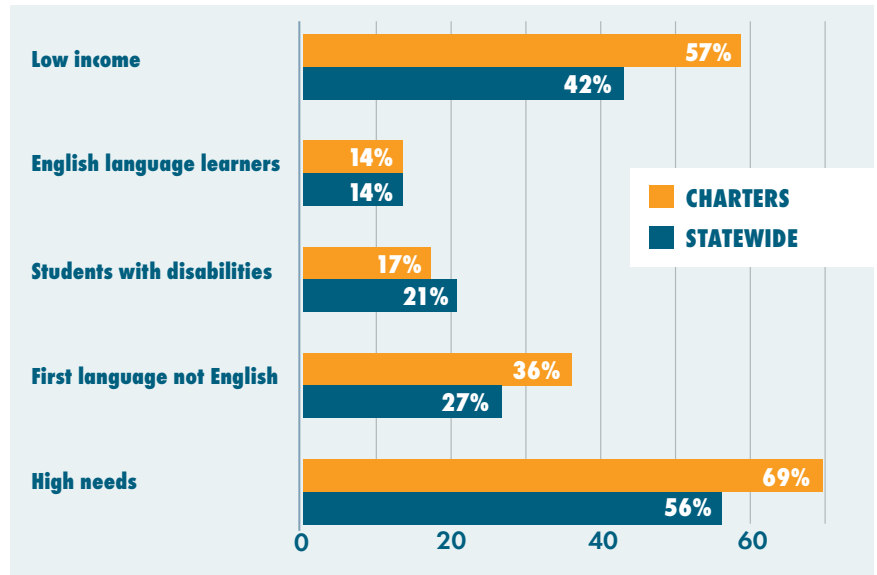

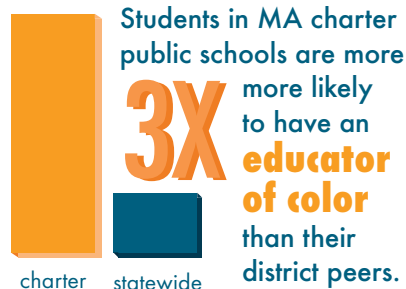

Charter public school students are **growing & learning rapidly.**

Each year, Massachusetts charter public school students demonstrate the equivalent of **41 extra days of learning** - or nearly 2 months of school - in both reading and math, as compared with their district peers.
